



THE FOURTH DEGREE

"THE PATRIOTIC DEGREE"

Since the Order's Fourth Degree celebrated its 100 anniversary in 2000, assemblies have played a prominent role in the new millennium, supporting active duty service members and first responders, honoring veterans, and promoting love of country.

Beginning in 1999, 4th degree assemblies and members raised and donated more than \$520,000 toward the construction of the WWII MEMORIAL in Washington, D.C., And were well represented at its dedication five years later.

In 2003, the 4th Degree began "SERVING THOSE WHO SERVED", a program to provide support to Veterans at VETERAN AFFAIRS medical facilities. These efforts continue to this day. In 2019 - 2020, SIR KNIGHTS volunteered 97,000 hours of service at more than 120 Department of Veteran's Affairs medical centers.

The Fourth Degree has also led the way in raising nearly \$2 million for the Co-Sponsored Seminarian program of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, U.S.A.

A historic change was introduced at the 135th Supreme Convention in St. Louis in 2017, when the familiar regalia used since the mid-20th century was replaced with a new uniform.
